### 2017 SPRING FLOODS IN QUEBEC



Over the past year, the Red Cross teams have worked tirelessly to assist the thousands of people who were impacted by the historic spring floods in Quebec in 2017. To this day, they continue to work with families that were hit the hardest to support them throughout their recovery.

The Red Cross is the Quebec government's main partner in providing services to people affected by a disaster. It supports the Ministry of Public Security and municipalities during disasters, which is why Red Cross teams were mobilized within moments to assist people whose homes were flooded.



### OUR RESPONSE From emergency to recovery



**5,708 families** received Red Cross assistance (hotel lodging, food, clothing, and financial support)



679 volunteers were mobilized



**Nearly 200 employees** in the Ready When the Time Comes program were released by their employers




**11 reception and information centres** were opened in cooperation with cities and municipalities during the emergency phase



**3 recovery offices** are still in operation in Gatineau, Rigaud and Pierrefonds-Roxboro

**Cynthia Pilon-Potvin** has been volunteering with the Red Cross fox six years. In spring 2017, her home was flooded along with those of her neighbours. Despite everything, she continued her volunteer work to help her community.
