Care for a Choking Child

If the child cannot speak, cough, or breathe or is making high-pitched noises, immediately begin care for choking.

Alternate between any two of the following methods until the object comes out: back blows, abdominal thrusts, and chest thrusts.

BACK BLOWS

- Place your arm across the child's chest.
- Bend the child forward and deliver up to 5 firm blows between the shoulder blades.




ABDOMINAL THRUSTS

- Place your fist just above the belly button.
- Give up to 5 quick, inward and upward thrusts.



CHEST THRUSTS

- Place your fist in the middle of the child's chest with your thumb facing inward, and place your other hand over your fist.
- Give up to 5 chest thrusts by pulling straight back.

Continue providing care until the object comes out or the child begins to breathe or cough. If the child becomes unresponsive, call EMS/9-1-1 and begin CPR, starting with chest compressions.
